


Scriptural Time Line of End-of-Age Events

Don't let anyone deceive you in any way. For that day will

not come unless the apostasy comes first and the man of lawlessness is revealed, the son of destruction. **4** He opposes and exalts himself above every so-called god or object of worship, so that he sits in God's sanctuary publicizing that he himself is God.—[2 Thessalonians 2:3-4](#)

The Wrath of God is a distinct time period. It is within the Great Tribulation, also called the Day of the Lord. A concordant search will reveal that we are born unto "Tribulation," but not unto "Wrath." During our life God chastens, permits afflictions, persecutions, and tribulations to, try, purge, and make us "white," even as silver is refined in the furnace, but, we are instructed to "wait for His Son from Heaven . . . even Jesus, which hath delivered us from the wrath to come."—[1 Thessalonians 1:10](#). [There is no reference in the bible to a "seven years of tribulation" period]

The term "delivered" in Greek is rhuomai, meaning "to rescue." His coming at the Rapture is therefore "to rescue" us from the wrath to come; NIV uses this rendering: "God hath not appointed us to *wrath*, but to obtain salvation . . . Wherefore comfort yourselves together."—[1 Thessalonians 5:9&11](#)-- Why? For we have received salvation from the "*Wrath* of God!"

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
